next week they got an awe inspiring show when Magic and Mischief (pictured to the right) came to town.


Our Teen Tuesday programs have been a blast as well. We had some Boredom Busting Board Games, where

Beyond the programming, June had the highest number of physical items circulated in the recorded history of the Oostburg Public Library! It's already been


a summer for the record books, but read on to see what's still coming up at the library this month! New at the Library How to Catch a Polar Bear Stacy DeKeyser


