I have a passion for libraries and the work they do—I love library programming, helping people learn new skills, and the joy of getting the right book to the right person.





- Mitchell Park Domes Pass





## Changes at the Library

Here are a few small changes we are making in the library:

- **Curbside Pickup:** We will no longer be offering curbside pickup for checked out materials in a bin outside of the library. If you have special circumstances where you need extra help getting materials out to your car (recent surgery or other mobility issues), just call the library and we can help: 920-564-2934
- **Library Cards Needed for Check Out and Picking Up Holds:** Please have your library card with you to pick up holds or check out materials. It makes it easier for us to ensure your card is being used appropriately and with your permission. Don't like carrying a physical card? We have an app for that! The Monarch2Go app lets you save your barcode number in the app and we can scan it from there! Or, save a picture of your barcode on your phone, that works too! When picking up books for other people's accounts, please bring their library card with you (with their consent, of course!). If you are picking up holds for another family member, you may use your own card by having us link your accounts. Ask a librarian for more information.
